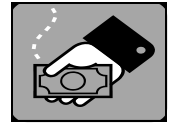

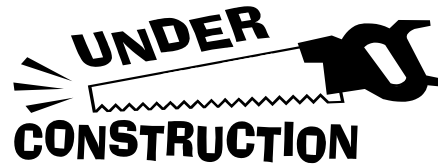

## Kirksville Ranks High in Quality of Life

Kirksville was recently ranked 41st out of 577 "micropolitan" cities. The national publication, Bizjournal surveyed 577 small cities for quality of life. Bizjournal measured cost of living, education system, medical facilities, amount of traffic, number of management and professional jobs, number of adults with bachelor's and master's degrees and per capita income. Based on these measurements Kirksville is a wonderful place to live.

Cities of 10,000 to 50,000 were included in the survey. In the region, Quincy, Illinois ranked 128th. Hannibal, Missouri ranked 144th. Ottumwa, Iowa ranked 196th. The top three micropolitan areas in the country were: Bozeman, Montana; Jackson Wyoming; and Durango Colorado.



The Chamber Office will be undergoing a major remodeling project in the very near future.
