KLTE, "The Light", K-Light, 107.9, signed on the air May 13, 1991 as a Contemporary Christian Music radio station. In March of 1996 the station was purchased by Bott Radio Network headquartered in Overland Park, KS. The Bott family owns and operates 23 radio stations including the newest addition in Nashville. In fact, most of the state of Missouri is covered by a BRN signal, as are other larger markets but from California to Tennessee. KLTE is a 100,000 watt station, broadcasting from a 1,000 foot tower located near New Boston giving the station a coverage of ninety to one-hundred miles in any direction of Kirksville. KLTE's studios and offices are located in the lower level of the Farm Credit Services building on Highway 63 and Crown Drive.

KLTE's programming consists of the nation's finest evangelical Bible teachers and apologists available. There are also interactive talk programs that cover social, political, legal, and financial topics. There is also a local public affairs program, "Light on the Heartland."

The format attracts a 25 plus adult age audience, who listen with the expressed intent of hearing something that will make a difference in their life. A niche market to be sure, however a very powerful group of consumers who trust what they hear on KLTE, and will make buying decisions based on that trust in the programming and the advertisers.

Judy Lene, Station Manager, has been a broadcaster since 1979 and came to Kirksville in 1985. Three other full-time employees include Sherie' Eklof, Production and Public Service Manager, Teresa Dorris, Office Manager, and Paul Shipman, Account Executive. Tom Lloyd is the station engineer.
