HEALTHY FOR LIFE PROGRAM

Healthy for Life is a heart disease and diabetes prevention program with two purposes: to educate the residents of northeast Missouri about risks for these diseases and learn how to prevent them and their side effects; and to help people work as groups to improve eating and activity habits.

Healthy for Life started as a grant from the Missouri Foundation of Health (MFH). The idea came from several healthcare and community action groups. Based on Department of Health and Senior Services information, northeast Missouri has a very high rate of diabetes, heart disease, and obesity. The grant provides for a full time health director and data management person to help this group by providing information, training, and classes.

Specifically, *Healthy for Life* offers prevention programs, risk assessment screenings, and community health programs in Adair, Knox, Linn, Macon, Schuyler and Scotland counties. There is also assistance for high-risk individuals or those who have been recently diagnosed with cardiovascular disease and/or diabetes with inadequate or no insurance coverage. Tourism Update

MUSOURI The Kirksville Area Chamber of Commerce recently received notification that our application has

been approved and our Chamber has been certified as a Designated Marketing Organization (DMO) by the Missouri Division of Tourism. This designation will allow us to apply for grants from the Missouri Division of Tourism and participate in the Cooperative Marketing Program.

Two conferences are coming to Kirksville this fall at the invitation of our Chamber staff. The Greater Missouri Leadership Challenge will bring 36 professional women from all aver Missouri into our community to enjoy our hospitality. These women will be in town September 14-16. On October 14th the Chamber will be hosting the Tri-State Development Summit bringing elected officials and business and civic leaders from Missouri, Illinois, and Iowa.
