

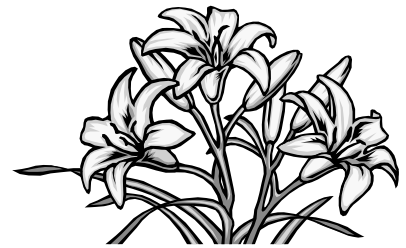

## Spring Clean Begins!



Kirkville's annual spring clean up will begin March 21 for addresses west of Baltimore and April 4 for addresses East of Baltimore. Residents should set out items the night before pickup.

City crews will collect tree limbs, household furniture, metal and miscellaneous items, household solvents, cleaners, and solidified paints (Liquid paints must be mixed with a solid material such as sand, absorbents, etc. before they can be picked up.).

City crews cannot pick up commercially generated hazardous waste, tires, batteries, motor oil or lubricants, demolition materials of any kind, regular household garbage, or more than one 10-cubic yard truckload per address.

All collections are made from curbside only. City employees are not allowed to go onto private property or into alleys. Please have items sorted - tree limbs in one group, furniture in one group, etc.

In addition to the free refuse collection, the City is offering the opportunity for residents to dispose of appliances for a small fee. If you have appliances that you would like picked up curbside, you will need to purchase a \$5 sticker for each non-freon appliance and a \$20 sticker for each freon-holding appliance, even if it does not currently hold freon. Stickers can be purchased at City Hall, 201 S. Franklin St., or at the customer service counter at Hy-Vee. Appliances should be set curbside with your other items, however, they will not necessarily be picked up at the same time as the other items.

Elderly or disabled residents who are not physically able to move their pick up items to the curb should contact Public Works at 627-1291. They will schedule a volunteer to assist you.

The Governmental Affairs Committee of the Kirksville Area Chamber of Commerce is pleased to offer to the voting citizens of the community, opportunities to meet our elected officials and those candidates running for the Kirksville City Council and Kirksville RIII School Board.

On **March 11th** Senator Cauthorn (R-18) and Representative Behnen (R-2) will address the community at the Adair County Annex Building from 10 a.m.—11:30 a.m. This is your opportunity to have an open exchange and ask questions of your elected officials. At 11:30 a.m. officials from Associated Industries of Missouri (AIM) and National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB) will be available to answer questions about legislative and bottom line issues from small business owners in the area.

On **March 22nd** candidates running for public office with the Kirksville City Council and the Kirksville R-III School Board have been invited to participate in a public forum at the Shrine Club. Candidates will be available for open discussion with the public at 6 p.m. and at 7 p.m. the formal forum will begin.
