### **Mac and Jill McCord — Cottage Grove Bed and Breakfast**

Thanks Mac and Jill for attending August's Business After Hours and congratulations for having your business "spotlighted" this month!

The Cottage Grove Bed and Breakfast, located at 301 S. Cottage Grove, was built as a private residence for Coe Ann and David Conyers from 1971 to 1972. The home, which sits on 1.5 acres of land is .8 of a mile from Truman and the same distance from the town square. Brashear Park is within two blocks. It is also located on the walking route that connects with the Kirksville schools' walking path. In 1991 Dr. Judy and Joe Misale bought the house and did a lot to improve it, flooring the entire 3500 sq ft basement, painting, and much more. **All guest areas are on the main floor. You have to see it to believe how beautiful.** Some of the unique features of the home include:

- Lava-stone pillared courtyard
- 11x13 foot tiled entry foyer
- Wide main hardwood hallway
- 18x26 foot common room with hardwood floor
- Huge lava stone fireplace with black marble hearth
- Four bedrooms— each with private bath, built in dresser, double closets, desks, king-size bed, telephone, TV with VCR, clocks, and radio
- Tiled kitchen/dining area that can seat 20 people
- Anderson windows that open and close
- Lighted ceiling fans in all main floor rooms
- Game room in basement with ping-pong table
- Central air conditioning
- A covered deck looking over the backyard acreage
- A backyard patio under a beautiful shade tree
- Covered parking available in inclement weather

## LEGISLATIVE FORUM



Thursday, October 7, 2004

The Governmental Affairs Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, along with KTVO TV 3, are planning this legislative forum giving the local voters a chance to meet local candidates and learn more about their candidacy.

Tables will be placed along the walls of the ballroom at the Shrine Club for all 16 of the local candidates to distribute literature and to meet people. The doors will open at 6:00 p.m. for circulation around the tables, and the 14 candidates for county offices will be recognized and introduced by the emcee at 6:30 p.m. Each of the 14 candidates will be given an opportunity to speak for one minute when introduced by the emcee.

A forum for the two state representative candidates will begin at 7:00 p.m. and last for one hour. The state representative candidates will field questions from a panel of five Chamber of Commerce members representing different interests (education, economic development, transportation, agriculture, and healthcare) in the community. The forum will be covered by the media, and it will be taped by KTVO to be shown later on both Channel 3 and the Kirksville Public Access TV Channel.
